About Haiti



Haiti is a Caribbean country occupying the western one-third of the island of Hispaniola it shares the island with the Dominican Republic. Haiti is about the size of the state of Maryland. It is located 50 miles from Cuba, and 600 miles from Miami, Florida. Haiti is the first independent black republic. Haiti has historically been poverty stricken due to a variety of factors including; war, war debt, occupations and dictatorships. Factors that are still impacting Haiti today include; current economic and environmental factors. Included in these factors are: international

aid sanctions, internal political conflict, deforestation as well hurricanes and all the after affects of the before mentioned factors.

The average Haitian earns less than \$3 a day, and survives on a mere \$1 per day. More than half of the population lacks access to clean water and sanitation. Fifty percent of the population is malnourished. One in five children are underweight and/or under-height for their age. Twelve percent of Haitian children die before their first birthday, and one third do not make it to their fifth. Only one in every 10,000 Haitians has



access to a physician. Today most Haitians are Christian with 50%-60% being Roman Catholic. The number of Protestants has been growing steadily, although Baptist and Pentecostal are the largest registered denominations, many others are represented. Many Haitians continue to practice Voodoo or incorporate Voodoo into Christianity as it has done for several hundred years.

Even with all the struggles that Haiti faces, there remain a people with open arms and smiling faces. It is a culture rich in music, art, and storytelling. The land is graced with beautiful beaches and breathtaking mountains. Some positive things are; Haiti is said to have the best beach in the Caribbean, they were the first Caribbean country to ever qualify for the soccer World Cup finals, artists in Haiti produce nearly all the crafts sold for tourism in the Caribbean, and it is the second largest exporter of Mangos to the U.S. (Arthur, 2004, pp.19-20). A trip to Haiti is truly a life changing experience full of beauty and sorrow it will give you a better appreciation for the strength of these amazing people.

Travel Information

Weather

The climate in Haiti is hot and humid. The average temperature in summer is between 85 and 95 degrees. For a current forecast go to www.weather.com and type Port-au-Prince, Haiti in the "Local Weather" box.

Clothing

Summer clothing is appropriate. Women should wear a skirt or a sundress to signify that you are a Christian Missionary. Capri's and walking shorts are acceptable. Sandals or tennis shoes are appropriate. DO NOT wear any jewelry that has sentimental value. A simple wedding ring is appropriate.

Showering

Bring your own unscented toiletries. Scented items attract bugs.

Immunizations

Immunizations are not required to be admitted into Haiti. However we suggest you go to www.cdc.gov/travel to see the recommended immunizations and medical precautions. You can also get information on the prescription medication you may be bringing with you. If immunizations are necessary they are typically available at your County Health Department or any Travel Clinic. It is recommended that you have a current Tetanus shot. Immunizations are not included in the trip fees.

Food

All meals while in Haiti are included in the trip fees. Breakfast and Dinner are provided at by Walls Guest House. You may also want to bring personal snacks. We will arrange for clean drinking water to be provided. It is recommended that you bring a sports bottle or canteen to fill with safe drinking water.

You are responsible for meals during travel to and from Haiti.

Luggage

At this time the airlines allow 2 checked bags weighing up to 50lbs each per passenger. We ask that your checked luggage be donated items for the orphanages. Your checked luggage may be a suitcase, a duffle bag if the airlines will allow it a plastic tote.

You should be able to fit your clothing and personal items in a rolling carryon. However, due to the tightened restrictions, please check with the airline on toiletries allowed in carry-on bags, you may need to pack some of them in your checked bags.

Your trip leader will provide a list of items that serve as a guide. Use your own discretion when requesting donated items.

Money

It is best to bring cash. Traveler's checks are difficult to exchange and credit cards are only accepted in some places. It is recommended that you take bills of \$20 or less. You may want to carry \$1's and 5's. Be sure to separate your money in different locations. I.E. some in your wallet, some in your bible, some in your suitcase, etc.... This is to ensure your money is not lost or stolen. You can bring a lock to put on your luggage when it is no longer in the hands of airport personnel. Be sure to bring your key or code.

Passport

It is required to have a passport valid for at least 6 months following the return of travel to Haiti. For information on attaining a passport please visit: travel.state.gov/passport. If you do not have passport you will want to start the application process as soon as possible.

Customs

You will be required to fill out a customs form on the plane before you arrive in Haiti. The address you should put on this form will be provided to you by your team leader in Miami the night before departure.

Airport

When traveling to other countries you will find the airports are not the same as in the States. Upon arrival, there will be many people waiting outside to "help you" with your bags. It can be very overwhelming if you are unaware. This is not a free service a payment is expected. Some people wait there all day just for the chance to make some money so be prepared. Your trip leader will arrange for any assistance that is needed to get the luggage from the airport to the van.

Final Note

There are no public restrooms, so there may be occurrences of people relieving themselves on the streets. Also, the modesty is different in Haiti than in the States so be prepared to see more than you're used to. Let this also serve as a reminder for your own needs as well.

•Mission Trip Fee- \$ 1,800. Fee includes: round trip airfare, room & board at Walls Guest House, 3 meals a day while in Haiti, local transportations and interpreters. The trip fee also includes a visit to a local beach with the children for a day of rest and fun-in-the-sun. Trip fee must be paid in full 30 days prior to trip departure.
